## From Pastor Matt

In August we will welcome to St. Peter an intern from Wartburg Seminary! As many of you know, St. Peter has been host to many interns/vicars over the years. While our proximity to Warburg makes this a logical relationship, I also believe that St. Peter is a special community of people who are well suited to help form leaders of the ELCA who will be in the parish very soon.

I wanted to share a few things about the program before we begin.

First, the cost of paying our intern is covered by the St. Peter Foundation, and is not part of the St. Peter budget. The Foundation operates independently of the church. If you would like to know more about how that works, please feel free to reach out to any member of the Foundation board.

And second, I want us to always keep in mind that an intern is a student. We as a congregation are the classroom. Our intern will be given responsibilities; they will help lead worship and preach regularly; facilitate education; and be given other opportunities to explore their gifts. At the same time, interns are not ordained ministers, nor have they received a formal call to serve a congregation.

The year spent as an intern is considered a year of “education” and is a requirement for graduation (along with classroom learning, not to mention ANCIENT GREEK!). There’s a lot to learn. We have the opportunity to help our intern develop and hone their ministry gifts in a safe environment, to find that sweet spot where vital book learning and theology meet practical everyday ministry. It’s also a chance for the intern and their family begin to live the rhythm of the church, where holidays and weekends are work days.

I am confident that our new intern will complement our existing staff and help us to continue to grow our current ministries at St. Peter—to share the love of God in Jesus Christ to Dubuque and the world!

## From Pastor Calvin

Happy Summer everyone!

I was thinking recently about scripture, and what we believe about scripture. **The Bible is the Word of God**, living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword. Martin Luther said that God’s Word comes to life when it is read aloud, which is why we read it aloud in church every Sunday. It’s why our liturgy is all based in scripture, too.

When God’s word comes to life, it meets us in new and fresh ways; it speaks to different parts of our life; it reminds us of God’s promises to us; and it brings us into a deeper faith in God. **I wanted to offer you a couple of resources for easy ways to get into God’s word this summer.**

First is **Luther Seminary’s God Pause**. If you Google “God Pause” it should be the first thing that comes up. It’s a daily devotional that has scripture and a devotion to go with it. The devotion can give context to the passage, and connects it to our everyday lives. The second resource is the **Christ in Our Home** devotional we offer for free at Church. Pick one up anytime; it has 3 months’ worth of devotionals. And finally, there is a website called **OpenBible.info** that has scripture verses by topic. You can search for any topic (e.g. peace, relationship, hard times, etc.) and a bunch of verses will pop up that have been voted for relevance by readers.

I want to encourage you, take some time this summer to read God’s word aloud, and maybe do a devotional once or twice a week. Do it with your family or friends. Do it with God. See how God’s word will come alive and be at work in your life

***Of the 42 kids who attended, 14 were non-members!***



## *From the Council President*

Happy Summer to all, as God has made this a great time at St. Peter and in Dubuque.

**Thank you to all 68 members who attended the Congregational Meeting** on Sunday, June 5. With a vote of 64 members in favor and 4 opposed we have decided to increase the hours and add benefits for our Education Coordinator position from 20 to 32 hours weekly. This is subject to us have enough members begin giving, or agree to increase their giving, annually to fund an additional \$19,000 annually for this increase. Thank you so much for your continuing strong support of our Christian Education and youth programming. As of this writing we have received \$15,760 in increased pledges toward our goal of \$19,000. If you are interested in helping us get to our goal, please reach out to Christine in the office or any of your Council members to share how you can help.

On June 11, 2022, **I was honored to represent our congregation at the NEIA Synod Assembly in Waverly.** This is the first time in 3 years we have been able to meet in person and hear our new Bishop Kevin Jones lead us in worship.

Below are some of the things that took place:

- Our **Pastor Matt** has been elected to a 3-year term on our Synod Council which meets remotely and in person. This is an important role as this Council assists our Bishop in overseeing our Synod operations.
- Our member **Rich Corfman** was elected to a 6-year term on the Synod Consultation Committee which helps with any challenging issues at any of our congregations.
- **I sat in on a session about Pastor Sabbaticals.** Very informative. I think we will be providing Pr. Matt a Sabbatical in the next couple years. Our Church Council will also be working on a Sabbatical Policy soon.
- **I also sat in on a session regarding racial discrimination** in our state and how that impacts our churches. Very informative also. We are planning on addressing some of these topics at our Adult Education in the Fall.

**Many of our Church Boards and Committees will not be meeting in July.** This has been a traditional month to take off for the summer. Check with your Board's Director, if you have questions.




